## Vision

- Creating queer-friendly conditions in the AWO-meeting center.
- The AWO-meeting center is perceived as a safe place for queer people all generations.
- Active participation of queer people of all generations on the activities and offers of the AWO-meeting center.
- Creating a context for intergenerational exchange between biographies and experiences of queer people.

## Goals

- Establishment of peer-groups for queer people at the AWO-meeting center.
- Provide spaces and resources for queer projects and initiatives.
- Active participation of the queer community in the meeting center, especially of TIN\* and BIPOC queer people of all generations.
